Dear Readers

Private enterprises should play a bigger role in revitalization in rural areas by developing their economy and helping achieve common prosperity.

Rural revitalization is a critical component of the 2020–2025 Chinese work plan that aims to foster a modern country that is prosperous, strong, democratic, culturally advanced and harmonious. Central authorities seek to achieve this by consolidating the achievements of poverty alleviation and pushing for the modernization of the agricultural sectors and rural areas, as demonstrated by recent plans and announcements put forward by the government.

Digital technologies, including 5G, artificial intelligence and cloud computing, are playing an increasingly important part in bridging the digital divide in rural areas, empowering the healthcare and education industries, and promoting rural-urban economic integration and rural revitalization.

The Ukraine-Russia conflict is affecting the global economy in a number of ways. Financial sanctions, commodities prices and supply-chain disruptions are three such major channels.

The forecast of global inflation is nearly 6% this year, but now that mark is expected to be exceeded. The main reason is the higher commodity prices, but the rise in inflation will offset the positive impact of higher commodity prices for producers.

Higher prices will also raise tricky questions for central banks. They had embarked on a course of monetary tightening to curb inflation, but may now be concerned about the impact of the Russia-Ukraine conflict on the post-coronavirus recovery.

The economic impact of the conflict will be felt most significantly in Ukraine and Russia, which will both experience sharp recessions this year. Those eastern European countries that are most dependent on trade with Russia, such as Lithuania and Latvia, will also take a hit from the conflict. Countries elsewhere in the world will suffer from an energy, supply-chain and trade shock.

Marine pollution is a global crisis that needs immediate attention from all of us. It is a threat to marine life and animal life. Water is not only vital for marine life but is also important for animal life. Rivers are a source of drinking water, water for agriculture, and fish for food. By polluting the rivers and sea, we are poisoning our water and food sources. We are creating famine, hunger and disease, both for ourselves and for future generations. It is high time we take responsibility for the damage and start protecting our planet. In this issue, we feature a project that helps preserve the environment in a healthy, sustainable way.

TIANJIN TO REQUIRE COVID-19 TESTS WITHIN 24 HOURS OF ARRIVAL



Tianjin will require all travellers to undergo a COVID-19 test within 24 hours of entering the city and report to the community. The measure is aimed at strengthening existing rules, which currently require travellers to be tested 48 hours prior to departure and have a green code on Tianjin's health-tracking application.

RAILWAY LINKING BEIJING WITH BINHAI NEW AREA OF TIANJIN UNDER CONSTRUCTION



With a length of about 172 kilometres and a designed speed of 350 kilometres per hour, the second intercity express railway linking Beijing with the Binhai New Area of Tianjin is expected to cut travel time between the two areas to 57 minutes.

CHINA SETS 2022 GDP TARGET AT AROUND 5.5%



China has set its economic growth target at around 5.5% in 2022 as the country's national lawmakers and political advisers gathered in Beijing to map out development priorities for this year. The gross domestic product (GDP) target is one of the key goals laid out in a much-anticipated government work report delivered by Premier Li Keqiang to the national legislature. The Chinese economy saw a strong rebound with 8.1% growth in 2021 and became the only major economy to record growth in 2020.

CHINA TO EXEMPT 3% VAT LEVIED ON SMALL COMPANIES



China will exempt the 3% Value Added Tax (VAT) levied on some small firms. The exemption will take effect from April 1 to December 31. The measure was part of a slew of policies aimed at supporting small firms and easing their financial burdens amid recent COVID-19 outbreaks and a slowing economy. Xu Hongcai, Vice Minister of Finance, told a press conference that all small firms can claim 100% VAT rebates this year compared with 60% previously.

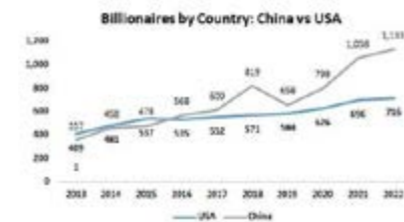
CHINA CUTS INCOME TAX TO 20% FOR SOME SMALL FIRMS



China announced a cut in income tax from 25% to 20% for some small enterprises, as a part of support for small businesses amid the economic downturn pressure. The income tax cut is designed for small companies with an annual taxable income not exceeding 3

million yuan, not more than 300 employees and assets below 50 million yuan, according to an online statement released by the Ministry of Finance. The lower income tax will be in effect from the start of 2022 until the end of 2024, according to the statement.

CHINA IS PRODUCING NEW BILLIONAIRES FASTER THAN ANY OTHER COUNTRY



China now has a total of 1,133 billionaires, a figure which is growing approximately three times faster than the US' billionaire population. Currently, the US has 716 billionaires. The three cities with the largest billionaire populations are now all in China, with Shenzhen recently bumping New York City from third place. Nonetheless, billionaires in the US are still wealthier than those in China. America's billionaires control approximately 32% of the combined wealth of all known billionaires in the world. Meanwhile, China's billionaires account for around 27% of this wealth.

EVERGRANDE SETS END-JULY TARGET FOR RESTRUCTURING PROPOSAL, HALTS TRADING IN ITS STOCKS



Evergrande Group will unveil a debt restructuring proposal for its creditors by the end of July, it said recently, after concerns about its financial health were renewed by a delay in publishing its annual results. Evergrande, whose \$22.7

billion worth of offshore debt is deemed to be in default, is seeking to "further enhance communications" with creditors to reach the end-July target, its Executive Director, Siu Shawn, told investors on a call. Trading in shares of Evergrande, its property services unit Evergrande Property Services Group Ltd, and electric vehicle unit China Evergrande New Energy Vehicle Group Ltd have been suspended.

USA BANS WORLD'S BIGGEST CONSUMER DRONE MAKER



US-based Figma, a cloud-based software platform for designers, has started to cut ties with Chinese firm DJI, the world's biggest drone maker, in compliance with US sanctions. In an email sent to DJI, Figma said it can no longer provide access to its software in compliance with US laws after DJI was put on a US tech sanctions list. DJI is the world's biggest consumer drone maker and the majority of its sales are overseas.

CHINESE STATE-OWNED FIRM SIGNS DEAL WITH PFIZER TO SUPPLY COVID-19 PILL



Pfizer's COVID-19 pill is one step closer to clinical use in China, with state-owned China Meheco Corp securing a deal with Pfizer to commercialise the drug within the year. The Chinese company signed a contract with Pfizer and was authorised to supply Paxlovid in China during the

2022 agreement period, China Meheco said in a statement. Paxlovid is the first foreign COVID-19 drug to enter China's market.

CHINA WILL NOT PILOT PROPERTY TAX REFORM IN MORE CITIES IN 2022



China's Finance Ministry has said there are no suitable conditions this year to expand the country's list of pilot cities for real estate tax reform. The judgement was made after various aspects were taken into consideration, a Ministry of Finance official told Xinhua when answering questions regarding the real estate tax reform pilot program. The program was implemented with the authorization of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, and investigations and preliminary studies have been carried out in some cities, the official said.

COVID-19 ANTIGEN TESTS TO BE INCLUDED IN MEDICAL INSURANCE



China has moved to temporarily include coronavirus antigen detection reagents and relevant tests into the country's provincial health insurance system. According to a notice issued by the National Healthcare Security Administration, related expenses made

at specific local medical institutions should be paid according to the region's existing health insurance regulations, while the expenses of antigen detection reagents sold at specific retail pharmacy stores can be paid through personal accounts under the health insurance system. This would largely decrease the amount of money people have to pay for those services.

CHINA CHANGES COVID-19 TREATMENT METHOD



The National Health Commission has updated the treatment playbook for COVID-19 based on the transmission characteristics of the virus' variants, including Delta and Omicron, as well as the high proportion of mild cases. According to the new plan, patients with mild symptoms will be put under quarantine in centralized locations, rather than be taken directly to hospitals as originally required. Patients will be transferred to a designated hospital for treatment only when their condition worsens. Additionally, the standards for lifting quarantine and discharge from hospital have been adjusted. Now, patients with a CT value of nucleic test equal to or higher than 35 can be discharged from the hospital. Recovered patients will undergo a 7-day home health monitoring instead of a 14-day quarantine.

CHINA PLANS TO PERMIT SMALL NUMBER OF FOREIGN STUDENTS TO RETURN



China said it is planning to allow a small number of foreign students with "actual needs" who have been stuck in their countries for about two years due to COVID visa bans to return to the country, amid reports that Beijing has issued visas to some Pakistani students. "On the basis of ensuring safety, it is coordinating arrangements for a small number of foreign students with actual needs to return to China in light of the changing international epidemic situation and the characteristics of the students' majors," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman, Zhao Lijian, told a media briefing.

Airlines were informed that transit passengers from so-called group A "high-risk" countries will be allowed to transfer through Hong Kong airport from next month. Hong Kong laid out broader changes to travel rules as part of the city's wider shift in its approach to COVID. Those include halving hotel quarantine time for travellers to 7 days from 14, and ending the flight ban on nine countries including the US, UK, and Australia. Risk profiles for countries, currently from ranked A to C, will also be abolished.

CHINA IN THE WORLD

PET OWNERS WHO ABANDON ANIMALS MAY FACE BIG FINES



People who abandon dogs or cats in Hubei province may face fines of between 1,000 yuan and 5,000 yuan, according to recently revised provincial regulations on animal epidemic prevention. According to the revisions, county governments are responsible for arranging care for abandoned pet dogs and cats, as well as the environmentally friendly disposal of animals that die of illness. Residents are also prohibited from raising "large and dangerous" dogs. Violators will be fined up to 10,000 yuan and their dogs will be removed.

HONG KONG AIRPORT TO LIFT TRANSIT PASSENGER BAN FROM APRIL 1



AIRPLANE CRASH CARRYING 132 PEOPLE IN GUANGXI PROVINCE



A China Eastern Airlines jetliner carrying 132 people crashed in the mountains in southern China's Guangxi region, according to China's Civil Aviation Administration. The Boeing-737 was en route from the southwestern city of Kunming to Guangzhou when it lost contact over the city of Wuzhou. On board were 123 passengers and nine crew members, the CAAC said in a statement posted online.

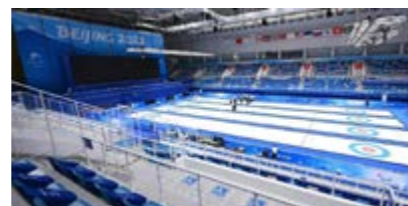
MARRIAGE HITS RECORD LOW IN CHINA



The Ministry of Civil Affairs has said that around 7.63 million marriages were registered in 2021, the lowest total since 1986 when records began. That compared with more than 8.13 million in 2020 and a peak of 13.46 million marriages in 2013. According to

independent analysis, the number of marriages per 1,000 people in China was 5.41 last year compared with 9.88 in 2013. And in a Communist Youth League survey of unmarried urban residents aged 18 to 26 in October, 43.9% of women respondents said they either had no intention of getting married or were unsure if it would happen.

STADIUMS FOR BEIJING WINTER PARALYMPICS TO BE OPEN TO PUBLIC



All venues of the Beijing 2022 Winter Paralympic Games will be open to the public after the games, in order to provide services for more people with disabilities and promote the development of barrier-free facilities for the disabled in the city and around the country. Many venues were transformed into places more friendly to people with impairments before the Beijing Winter Paralympics. In the National Indoor Stadium, many facilities have been tailored for athletes with disabilities.

BEIJING TO STRICTLY ENFORCE EMERGENCY RESPONSE MECHANISM FOR CROSS-PROVINCE TRANSPORTATION

Beijing will strictly enforce an emergency response mechanism for cross-province transportation, according to Beijing Municipal Commission of Transport. A total of 211 inter-provincial public transportation routes have been suspended between Beijing and cities in Hebei, Tianjin, Shanxi, Inner Mongolia, East China's Shandong, Jiangsu, Anhui and other provinces, with 548 vehicles taken off the roads. The city will timely suspend cross-province passenger transport services to and from areas reporting COVID-19 cases.

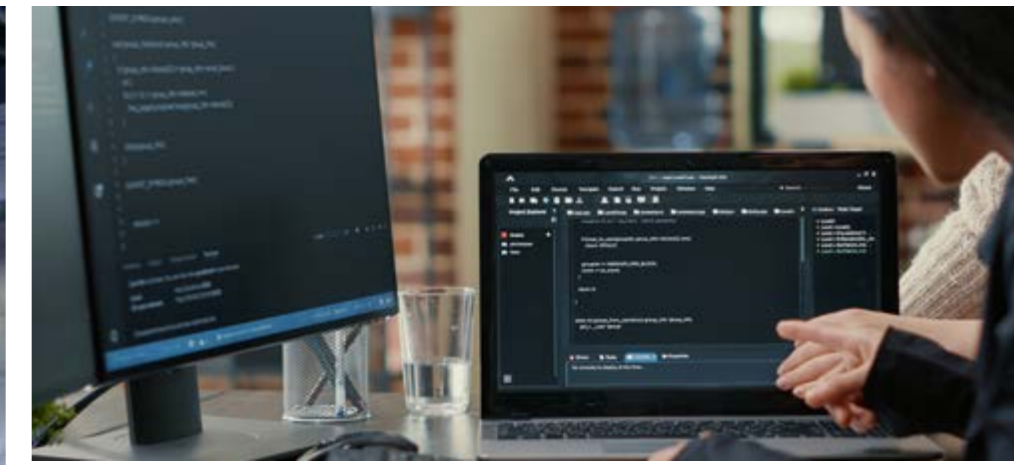

COMPUTER POWER TO BE GAINED BY LESS DEVELOPED AREAS

China plans to channel more computing and technical resources from its eastern regions to its less developed yet resource-rich western regions. This is expected to motivate the digital economy and promote high-quality, sustainable development as well as to help reach the goals of carbon peak and carbon neutrality.

Acceleration of construction on an integrated national big data system, optimizing the energy efficiency of data centres, speeding up digital transformation and upgrading industries, are also anticipated to be achieved jointly in this effort.

As a way to improve overall resource efficiency and computing power, the country has recently approved the building of eight national computing hubs and plans for 10 national data centre clusters. NDRC and three other central government

departments jointly approved these projects, which mark the completion of the overall layout for the national integrated big data centre system.

The eight national computing hubs will be built in the Beijing-Tianjin-Hebei and Yangtze River Delta regions, the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area, the Chengdu-Chongqing economic circle, the Inner Mongolia and Ningxia Hui autonomous regions and Guizhou and Gansu provinces, according to the NDRC.

Although most of China's data centres are in the eastern regions, shortages of land and energy resources in those areas threaten the sustained

development of the data centres, while the western regions, have no shortage of resources, especially renewable energy. That gives them the potential to nurture the development of data centres that meet the needs of data computing in eastern areas.

The projects will also help improve the nation's overall computing capacity, promote green development, boost investment in the industrial chain of data centres and facilitate the coordination of development among different regions, the NDRC said.

China's next step is to speed up efforts to improve the influence of the eight national computing hubs to drive the integrated and coordinated development of data computing across the nation.

Building a national computing power network will enable the less developed regions to handle and store data transmitted from the economically advanced areas, optimize resource allocation and enhance efficient use of resources. That, in turn, will resolve excessive data surges and imbalances in regional computing capacity, experts said.

A large number of data centres are poised for location in western regions, which will greatly increase the use of green energy like photovoltaic and wind power. After years of development, China has taken a leading global position in big data. The Ministry of Industry and Information Technology unveiled a plan for the big data sector's development during the 14th Five-Year Plan period (2021-25), envisaging a scale topping 3 trillion yuan by the end of 2025, with a compound annual growth rate of around 25%.

Tech giants from home and abroad are moving in that same direction. Apple Inc, Huawei Technologies Co and Tencent Holdings Ltd have built data centres in Guizhou province due to its cooler climate and ample power resources. Investment in data centres in Guian New Area in the province is expected to exceed 100 billion yuan by 2025, according to the area's big data development service centre.

It said the average power usage effectiveness of the data centres, a measurement of how efficiently a centre uses its power, has been found to comply with the government guideline to promote green data centres.

Alibaba Cloud, the cloud computing arm of Alibaba Group Holding Ltd, has set up over 100 data centres in 25 regions around the world, and five of them are super data centres with massive numbers of servers.

Alibaba Cloud's super data centre in Ulaanqab, Inner Mongolia, started providing cloud computing services in June 2020. The data centre mainly uses renewable energy sources, such as wind and photovoltaic power.

The company's western cloud computing centre and data service base was launched in Chengdu, Sichuan province, in November 2020.

Tencent said it will optimize the layout of existing data centres and improve cross-regional computing power allocation to bolster the intensive, large-scale and green development of data centres and empower the digital economy. **B**

GLOBAL ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS OF THE UKRAINE-RUSSIA WAR

The Ukraine-Russia conflict will affect the global economy in a number of ways. Financial sanctions, commodities prices and supply-chain disruptions are three such major channels.

A sanctions package was unveiled by the US in late February targeting the Central Bank of Russia (CBR). The EU has followed suit. These sanctions will prevent the CBR from accessing about half of the US\$643bn that it holds in foreign-exchange reserves by blocking its ability to convert assets held in US dollars and euros into rubles. The measure also prevents Russia from tapping its emergency sovereign wealth fund, the National Wealth Fund (NWF). In addition, the US and the EU have announced that

some Russian banks will be cut off from SWIFT, the global payments system.

The Economist Intelligence (EIU) expects that the most serious effect of the conflict for the world economy will come in the form of higher commodities prices, since the global impact of sanctions will be limited. Commodity prices could jump owing to concerns around supplies and the destruction of physical infrastructure and sanctions. It is assumed that neither the EU nor the US will impose a ban

on Russia's hydrocarbon exports. The prices for oil, gas, base metals and grains will jump even in the absence of an embargo.

Oil prices will remain above US\$100/b as long as conflict rages in Ukraine. The threat of sanctions on Russian hydrocarbon exports and uncertainty surrounding supplies will exacerbate existing market tightness. Some oil traders are also avoiding Russian oil out of concern about US secondary sanctions on financial transactions with Russian entities.

Gas prices will rise by at least 50% this year, on top of a fivefold rise last year.

Russia is also a major producer of several base metals such as aluminium, titanium, palladium and nickel, all of which will register price jumps. Following spikes in all of these markets last year, prices will remain at peak levels as long as the conflict continues. This will have a substantial impact on industrial sectors across the globe.

Prices of agricultural commodities will soar. Taken together, Ukraine and Russia account for more than a quarter of the global wheat trade and produce 12% of calories consumed globally. Disruptions to trade routes in the Black Sea would increase pressure on grains prices.

Financial sanctions will have an impact on supply chains and trade, as companies will struggle to find financial channels through which to conduct trade with Russia. In addition, the possible destruction of some transport infrastructure will compound existing supply-chain issues.

Disruption to supply chains will come from three sources: difficulties affecting land-based routes; restrictions on air links; and the cancellation of sea freight routes from Ukraine.

Land-based trade routes between Asia and Europe will be disrupted as transit through Russia becomes more difficult. This will particularly affect some Chinese companies which had increased their traffic over land-based routes through Russia as an alternative to sea and air freight during the coronavirus pandemic.

Air ties between Russia and Europe will be severely hampered following the decision of EU countries to close their airspace to Russian aircraft and cargo. About 35% of global freight was being transported by air prior to the pandemic, about half of which was carried on passenger planes.

Sea freight routes through the Black Sea will be cancelled for several weeks following Ukraine's decision to shut down commercial shipping and Turkey's move to restrict transit through the Bosphorus. This situation will have a notable impact

on grain shipments transiting through Ukrainian, Russian, and possibly Bulgarian and Romanian ports.

Higher commodities prices will fuel global inflation this year and possibly in 2023. EIU was already forecasting global inflation of nearly 6% this year, but now that mark is expected to be exceeded, given the huge spikes in commodities prices. ACCEL EYES A BIGGER SHARE OF THE COUNTRY'S FULL FLIGHT SIMULATOR MARKET

Accel Flight Simulation Co Ltd, a Tianjin-based full flight simulator producer, aims to grab a bigger market share in China, in an industry that has been dominated by Western companies.

The company expects to seize 15% of the domestic market share as the first sales target of the company's market breakthrough efforts, Ding Yuanyuan, Accel's general manager and CTO said.

China currently has a total of 215 units of FFS, which included 186 produced by Canadian Aviation Electronics Inc and L3Harris Technologies from the United States. Six others were produced by domestic market players, including three by Accel.

The company announced its completion of the Airbus A320 neo and the Boeing 737 MAX FFS last year, making it the first and the only company in China to acquire an extensive full life cycle experience on the research, development and engineering of the major narrow-body level D FFS, for both the Airbus A320 and the Boeing 737 MAX, said CAAC News, a newspaper under the China Aviation Administration.

A company under Shanghai Juneyao Group Co Ltd said it had also completed its first 737 MAX FFS, but the simulator is only manufactured for Juneyao Airlines.

The FFS level D is the highest level of technology in the field of simulation and the level D should gain qualification issued by the CAAC under current regulations in China.

Statistics from aviation magazine Flight Global indicated that of the 1,550 FFSs installed worldwide, 59% were



manufactured by CAE and 17% by L3Harris.

Ding projects that in China, the annual market demand for FFSs stands between 16–20 units annually in the next five years, equivalent to 1 billion yuan in terms of overall market value.

In addition, the country's market demand accounts for one-fifth of the world's total, while its market demand is rising thanks to the country's strong economic growth.

Ding's forecast coincided with the Boeing Commercial Market Outlook 2020–2039, which is upbeat on the Chinese market. Total FFS demand will top 340 units in the period, involving a total investment of 28 billion yuan.

In light of the strong market demand, the Accel general manager noted he is fully aware of the challenges ahead.

Accel was set up by US-based Collins Aerospace and Beijing Bluesky Aviation Technology Co in 2014, with an initial investment of 390 million yuan. After Bluesky left in 2015, Haite Hi-tech, a privately owned limited company, joined up.

Now Accel is trying to leverage its strong technical capabilities built up from the full flight simulator life cycle



development experience to tap into simulation and training solutions for new industry segments.

It has recently inked agreements with leading domestic eVTOL producers Anhui Huamin Avionics System Co and Shanghai Volant, respectively.

Accel's strategy is in line with the government's efforts to boost manufacturing industries in the 14th Five-Year Plan period (2021-25) and CAAC's latest announcement to boost the "smart aviation" industry. Accel also has a clear vision on the strategy to penetrate the urban air mobility market. **3**

China is expected to dominate strategic technologies, including AI, within a decade or two, according to the US media report.

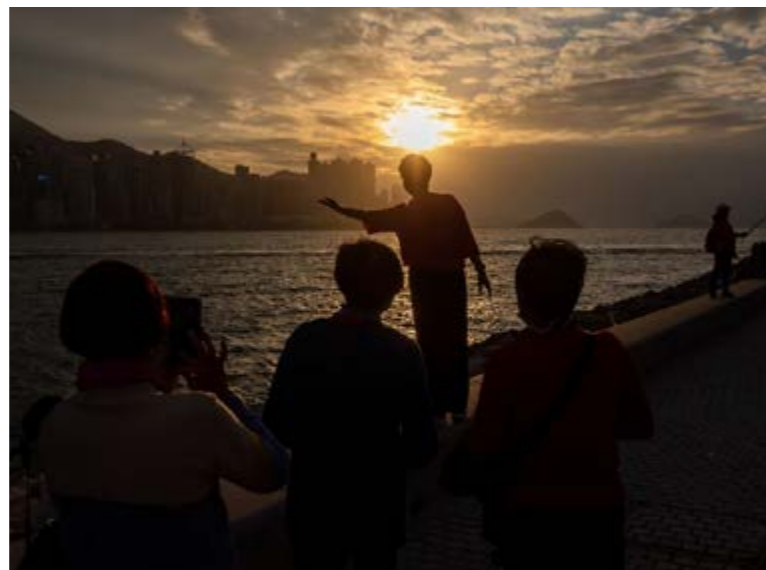

The Securities and Futures Commission (SFC) has given an in-principle nod to expand Wealth Management Connect to the hundreds of licensed brokerages in the city, subject to applications and other requirements.

AMAZON TO DIVERT FREIGHT FROM CHINA TO AVOID IMPACT FROM COVID LOCKDOWNS

Amazon Inc said it would counter any disruptions due to the lockdowns in Chinese cities by diverting freight to warehouses in unaffected regions, as companies rush to comply with the country's controls to curb the spread of COVID-19. The e-commerce giant said it had purchased more local inventory during the early outbreak of the Omicron variant to stay better prepared to handle potential disruptions.

Apple supplier Foxconn and other companies, including Japan's Toyota Motor, fuelled concerns over how global supply chains could be impacted as China deals with its biggest spike in COVID infections since early 2020. Multiple Chinese provinces and cities have tightened restrictions in line with Beijing's zero-tolerance goal of suppressing COVID-19 as quickly as possible, including the southern Chinese tech hub of Shenzhen. The Shenzhen Cross-border E-commerce Association, which groups about 2,800 retailers using platforms such as Amazon, said its members felt the pain of supply disruptions. The association said there would be some short-term impact on cross-border platforms such as Amazon as goods may not be delivered on time. The factory shutdowns were also causing delays in deliveries, while logistical difficulties were making it challenging to ship goods to overseas customers, manufacturers in the region said.

Banks have stepped up efforts to provide more effective support to small businesses by using financial technologies and better sharing enterprise credit information among lenders and government agencies, as China endeavours to promote high-quality development of inclusive finance.

During a recent meeting of the Central Committee for Deepening Overall Reform, President Xi Jinping said China will promote high-quality development of inclusive finance and build a sound financial system, which is highly adaptable, competitive and inclusive, to better meet the diversified financial needs of the people and the real economy.

The country will strengthen supervision and assessment to promote a marked increase in inclusive loans to micro and small businesses and a further rise in the proportion of collateral-free loans and first-time loans, said this year's

Government Work Report delivered by Premier Li Keqiang at the fifth session of the 13th National People's Congress on March 5.

The product demonstrates the bank's attempts to engage in digital inclusive finance, which involves the deployment of digital means to reach currently financially excluded and underserved businesses and populations with a range

of financial services suited to their needs.

By the end of 2021, the balance of loans to small businesses that have a total credit line of up to 10 million yuan per borrower was 19.1 trillion yuan, up 24.9% year-on-year, according to the China Banking and Insurance Regulatory Commission.

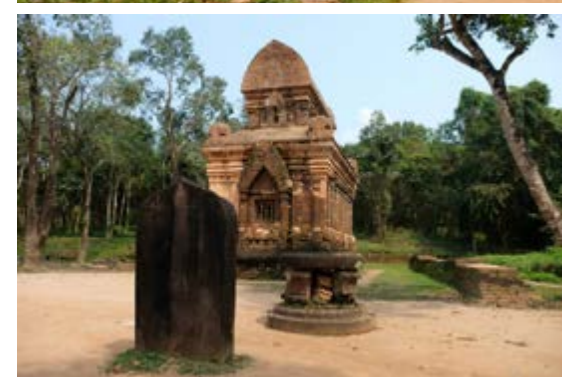
MY SON

A UNESCO PROTECTED AREA

The Largest Archaeological Site Embedded with Hindu Mythology

My Son is a UNESCO World Heritage Site located in the southern part of Vietnam. This site in Indochina holds historical value as being the longest inhabited archaeological site. Today, most of the site is in ruins due to the US carpet bombing during the Second Indochina War. The site mainly features Hindu temple clusters dedicated to Lord Shiva, with construction dating back to between the 4–14th century of the Champa regime. For an avid historian, this place is well worth exploring.





HOW TO GET THERE

By Air

It is easy to reach Vietnam by air as eight international airports offer e-Visa services.

Tourists can travel to Hanoi International Airport, Ho Chi Minh City International Airport or Da Nag International Airport. However, for tourists to My Son, Tan Son Nhat International Airport is the nearest one, with excellent connectivity from Ho Chi Minh City International Airport.

By road

Hoi An is the stopover point for travel to My Son, and it will take about an hour's drive by car from there. The taxi will cost about \$5, and the entrance fee will be \$7. There is no public transport service connection to the My Sib historical park. It is best to take a bus to the closest bus stop at CH Phan, about 9 km from the park entrance. It would be better to hire a private taxi from Danang or Hoi An for travelling to My Son.

By Sea

One can travel to Vietnam by sea through the Mekong Delta from Cambodia. You can book a cruise or ferry, depending on your budget. These cruises or ferries will take around 7 to 8 hours.

BEST TIME TO VISIT

The archaeological site of My Son is relatively small and is usually thronged with tourists. It is best to visit this site in the late afternoon as most group tours will have departed by noon.

Moving Around

Vehicles are allowed only up to 100 metres from the temples. You can tour the relics in a tram, and the tram station is close to the ticketed entrance. Open-sided electric trams take tourists for 2 km along a paved road to reach the relics, after which they can disembark and visit the historical remnants. If time permits, it would be a good idea to walk around the park.

Visa Formalities

Vietnam maintains a tourism-friendly visa policy, and as a result, most American, European, Australian and Indian citizens can use e-Visa facilities. Also, Vietnam offers visa-free entry services to a few countries for periods ranging from 14 days to 90 days. An e-visa will be valid for 30 days from the date of entry, and it will take about three days for the processing. The cost of an e-visa is US\$25 per person, and tourists with e-visas can enter Vietnam only through any of the eight international airports.



THINGS TO DO IN MY SON

Marvel at the ancient Hindu Temples

My Son is an archaeological site with a sprawling spread of ancient Hindu temples dedicated to Lord Shiva. These temples were built by King Champa and were active Lord Siva worship centres during the Champa dynasty. The available archaeological findings suggest that the place may also have been used as a burial location for Cham monarchs. Most temple sites are in ruins today, and only 20 of the 68 structures survive. It is a famous UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Visit the My Son Museum

Just next to the park entrance lies the My Son Museum. Tourists can delve into the depths of Champa culture, religion and lifestyles through the relics and artefacts in this museum. The museum also has important material that will explain the Hindu symbolism and mythology depicted in the designs and motifs in the temples.

Enjoy the Dance and Music Performances at My Son Sanctuary

Lord Shiva is the main deity worshipped in all the temples here, and the Cham people are followers of Shiva. A stunning and mysterious Shiva dance is performed in the quiet space of the sacred valley. The dancers dance with charm, mystery and grace. The Cham music is very spiritual and essential for the cosmic bliss of the Shiva dance. The beautiful Apsara dance here is a visual treat to behold.

Visit Hoi An

This ancient city is roughly 50 km from My Son. The town still bears a bygone colonial elegance. The distinct moss-covered roofs, lacquered carvings on the walls and the lantern decoration in the streets give you a glimpse of a century-old Vietnam. **B**

JD.COM, ALIBABA LIFT HANG SENG AGAIN AS CHINA'S SUPPORT SPURS CONFIDENCE

Hong Kong stocks advanced as investors regained confidence after China vowed to support the market with coordinated measures. The Federal Reserve raised its benchmark interest rate for the first time since 2018 to contain inflation, underscoring optimism in the economic outlook.

The Hang Seng Index climbed 5.8% to 21,250.97 at the local noon trading break, adding to the biggest rebound since October 2008. The Tech Index surged 7.3%, following a record 22% jump, while the Shanghai Composite Index gained 2.6%.

JD.com and Alibaba Group Holding led gainers, surging by at least 10% to HK\$243.80 and HK\$99.90 respectively. Meituan soared 11.7% to HK\$156.40 while Tencent gained 5.7% to HK\$387.80. Developer Country Garden

jumped more than 22% to HK\$5.29. This advance added to a massive rebound after a State Council committee vowed to ensure market stability after valuations slumped to multi-decade lows. Investors dumped stocks over the past month amid a resurgence in Omicron cases, while the Ukraine invasion and delisting pressures on US-listed Chinese stocks sapped global risk appetite. US policymakers boosted the federal funds rate by 25 basis points to a range of 0.25% to 0.5% as expected, while also signalling six more increases this year in the lift-off, after consumer prices rose by the most in four decades.

The Hong Kong Monetary Authority raised its base rate to 0.75% in lockstep under its pegged exchange rate system. While the local one-month interbank rate adjusted to 15-month



high of 0.27%, commercial banks are not expected to tweak their lending rates to shield borrowers.

CLICKBAIT CRACKDOWN TO PROTECT TECH CONSUMERS

The Ministry of Industry and Information Technology said it will intensify its crackdown on illegal practices like companies offering online links, clickbait, that trick users into downloading malicious apps, as part of its broader efforts to safeguard consumers' legitimate rights and interests.

The comments came after China Media Group's annual consumer rights gala to celebrate the annual World Consumer Rights Day exposed a string of online services and electronic products that infringe on consumers' legitimate rights and interests.

The ministry said three apps that were found to have deceived users into downloading malicious apps in the name of offering free Wi-Fi services, have been punished: all online app stores have been asked to remove the three apps, including the one whose name roughly translates as a Wi-Fi

cracking wizard.

The top industry regulator said the companies concerned will be punished in accordance with laws and regulations, and it will also arrange third-party testing agencies to conduct comprehensive technical testing of all Wi-Fi connection apps, and deal with any problems found.

When it comes to companies such as Ma'anshan Baizhu Network Technology Co Ltd that were found triggering consumers into downloading bundled apps, relevant provincial communications administrations will conduct deeper investigations into the problems and punish them in accordance with laws and regulations, the ministry said.

Ma'anshan Baizhu Network Technology Co Ltd was not immediately available for comment. According to the ministry, more efforts will also be made to ensure



the security features of smartwatches tailor-made for children. It will strengthen technical testing, supervision and inspection of children's mobile smart devices. If the devices fail to meet safety standards, the firms concerned will be punished in accordance with laws and regulations.

THREE CHINESE COMPANIES PLAN SWISS LISTINGS

Three Chinese companies—an engineering machinery maker, a battery producer and a medical equipment manufacturer—unveiled plans to list on the SIX Swiss Exchange, as Beijing reaffirms its support of offshore listings.

Shanghai-listed Sany Heavy Industry, and Shenzhen-traded Gotion High Tech and Lepu Medical Technology (Beijing) said in respective filings that they aim to sell Global Depository Receipts in Switzerland to fund global expansion.

The companies also said they were answering government calls to strengthen connectivity between Chinese and European capital markets, and that listing overseas would help broaden financing

channels and improve corporate governance.

Late last year, China broadened a stock connect scheme linking Shanghai and London to include capital markets in Germany and Switzerland.

The first batch of applicants under the expanded scheme comes as Chinese vice premier Liu He said the

Chinese government continues to support offshore listings by domestic companies.

China's securities regulator also vowed to keep overseas listing channels open, part of a concerted effort to



appease investors worried about a possible financial decoupling amid heightened geopolitical tensions between Beijing and Washington.

CHINA'S SMALL BANKS COME UNDER SCRUTINY FOR THEIR SUPPORT OF MOSCOW AMID US, EU FINANCIAL HURDLES

China's smaller banks could come under greater scrutiny over financing to Russia as the nation's biggest lenders are already showing signs of complying with U.S. and European sanctions in a bid to protect their large international footprints.

Within the commercial banking system, one model allowing China to support its strategic partner would be through an institution similar to the Bank of Kunlun, a small and unlisted state-owned lender which continued to finance payments to Iran even after Washington shut the bank out of the dollar market.

China's overall willingness to support Russia is still unclear, with President Xi Jinping calling for negotiations over Russia's invasion of Ukraine. The full extent of Washington and European Union sanctions are also still being worked out. The White House has said "selected" Russian banks would be removed from the SWIFT messaging

system, though officials were also looking at exceptions for the energy sector.

But any candidate for financing to Russian entities sanctioned by the West would need to be willing to give up its access to dollar and euro markets, and face restrictions on foreign investment if they are listed on stock exchanges.

While continuing to deal with Russian entities sanctioned by the U.S. and EU would not be illegal under Chinese or international law—China has not imposed sanctions on Russia and neither has the United Nations—banks run the risk of secondary sanctions if they do business with sanctioned entities, which can cut off their ties with U.S. and EU investors.

Two of China's largest state-owned banks, Industrial & Commercial Bank of China Ltd. and Bank of China Ltd.,



are restricting financing for purchases of Russian commodities, especially in dollars, according to people familiar with the matter. Both are large banks with close ties to the U.S. and European banking systems, where violation of sanctions could see their operations curtailed.

Chinese banks had about \$33 billion of outstanding lending to Russian entities in 2021, compared with \$56 billion of EU and U.K. bank lending, according to Natixis SA estimates based on data from the Bank for International Settlements.

GOVERNMENT PLEDGES MEASURES TO BOOST GROWTH

China has pledged a host of measures to boost the economy and stabilize the capital market, restoring market confidence as the economy faces fresh headwinds.

The nation will step up efforts to "keep the economy within an appropriate range and maintain the stable performance of the capital market" while upholding market-oriented principles and deepening reform and opening-up, according to a key meeting chaired by Vice-Premier Liu He.

Chinese stock markets rallied after the meeting. The Shanghai Composite Index jumped 3.48% to close at 3,170.71 points, while Hong Kong's Hang Seng Index surged 9.08% to close at 20,087.5 points.

Related authorities should "actively roll out policies conducive to the market and remain cautious when introducing any measures that have contractionary effects," said a statement released after a meeting of the State Council's financial stability and development committee.

The meeting called for proactive steps by monetary authorities to bolster first-quarter economic performance, measures to resolve the risks faced by real estate enterprises and promote a new development pattern in the sector, and steps to complete the rectification of big platform firms as soon as possible while boosting the healthy growth of the platform economy.

At the meeting, it was also said that



Chinese and US regulators have made positive progress on issues related to Chinese firms listed in the United States and are working on specific cooperation plans.

In line with the meeting's requirements, China's central bank said in a statement that it will proactively maintain proper growth in new loans and beef up support for smaller businesses.

NEW ZEALAND'S FONTERRA SAYS CHINA DEMAND IS HOLDING UP DESPITE COVID-19 GROWTH CONCERNS

Demand for dairy products is holding up in China despite concerns about an economic slowdown and the impact of COVID-19 outbreaks, a senior executive at New Zealand's Fonterra Co-operative Group said.

Fonterra, the world's largest dairy exporter, posted a 13% fall in half-year profit after its margins were squeezed by rising input costs and lower milk collections in New Zealand due to bad weather.

Sales margins also took a hit from raw milk prices rising due to constrained supply and strong demand, it said.

Chief financial officer Marc Rivers said that if lockdowns to contain COVID-19 in China, Fonterra's biggest export market, hurt demand, the co-op could switch its product mix toward consumer goods from the food-service sector.

Dairy prices fell for the first time this year in the Global Dairy Trade auction, which analysts said was due largely to concerns about Chinese demand. Even after this week's fall in prices, the Global Dairy Trade price index has risen 18% since the start of 2022.

China recently reported some unexpectedly strong economic data for early 2022, but analysts have cautioned that any nascent recovery could be tested by surging COVID-19 cases, a weak property market and an uncertain global recovery.

Fonterra last month lifted its forecast range for what it will pay farmers for milk in the 2021/22 season, passing on the benefit of strong global milk prices.

Fonterra's net profit after tax for the six months ended January 31 came in at NZ\$364 million (S\$337 million), down from NZ\$418 million recorded in the year-ago period.



The company's Greater China earnings before interest and tax fell 20% due largely to the food-service sector, which saw revenue grow 7% but margins contract.

The Auckland-based dairy exporter declared an interim dividend of 5 New Zealand cents per share, the same as last year.

Recently, the civil engineering firm of Sinopec Tianjin Nangang Ethylene Project kicked off, marking a high-end new materials project cluster as Sinopec Group in TEDA Nangang Industrial Zone enters a new phase.



In 2021, Sinopec invested 60.3 billion yuan in 11 project clusters in Nangang, and the Nangang Ethylene project was the first. With the 1.2 million tons/year ethylene cracking unit as the core business, the project expanded its industry chain to build 13 high-end new material units such as ultrahigh molecular weight polyethylene. Plans are for the project to be built in 2023 and put into use in 2024. When it starts operation, it will provide the zone with characteristic chemical materials and high-end special chemical products. It will engage 100 million downstream industries, and further promote the high-end, intelligent, green and integrated transformation and upgrading of the traditional petrochemical industry.

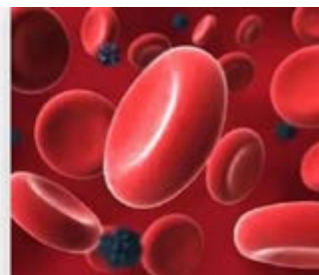

Recently, Tianjin UNS Biotech Co., Ltd. completed the Series A financing of 20 million yuan. This round of financing was invested exclusively by Zhongke Haichuang, a national professional equity investment institution. It will mainly be used to accelerate the development of high-end market projects for blood purification, including promoting the clinical transformation of blood purification products related to artificial kidney and artificial liver support system, and promoting the R&D of technologies related to viruses, tumours and metabolic diseases.

The company was founded in TEDA in 2013. Committed to the R&D, production and sales of blood purification and treatment products for critical and difficult illness in

humans, it has created a series of leading products related to blood purification materials.

TEDA BESTOWN CHUANGMENG SPACE OPENS



Recently, the Bestown Chuangmeng Space was put into use. Located in Binhai-Zhongguancun Science and Technology Park, this covers comprehensive service, commercial facilities, public exchange and exhibition, and technology and finance. It will further improve the integrated facilities and business environment.

The total construction area is around 4,400 square metres. There is a one-stop service centre, with facilities for coffee, simple business meals and other commercial services on the first floor. A well-known coffee chain in China, Bracket Coffee, has located its first Tianjin's store here. TEDA Administrative Station plans to provide enterprises with the whole process of "administrative service + enterprise service + investment promotion service". On the second floor, there are multi-function halls including a new products exhibition hall, a roadshow hall, a live-streaming room, a public conference room and a gym. Tianjin SMEs Credit Guarantee Centre on the third floor is committed to providing technological and financial services for enterprises in the Park. Jinjing Hulan, a national-level share working space on the fourth and fifth floors focuses on incubating enterprises, helping the youth with entrepreneurship and innovation.

A TOP 500 ENTERPRISE INVESTS IN TEDA

Recently, Sichuan Commercial Investment Supply Chain Management Co., Ltd. set up a commercial factoring company and a carbon asset management company in TEDA. Committed to the upstream and downstream activities of the parent company, the two new subsidiaries will start carbon asset management and carbon financial services. Sichuan Commercial Investment Supply Chain

Management Co., Ltd. is the wholly-owned subsidiary of Sichuan Commercial Investment Group Limited Liability Company, which is one of top 500 Chinese enterprises.

Promoting the low-carbon development of regional industries, professional institutions in the field of "carbon neutrality and carbon peaking" such as Tianjin Climate Exchange, the TEDA Eco Centre and Carbon Neutrality Institute of Binhai New Area Environmental Innovation Research Institute have gathered in TEDA, where they initially offer service capabilities such as carbon trading, carbon inventory, and low-carbon technology research and promotion. The development of regional factoring industry leads the country, with the total assets of factoring enterprises exceeding 150 billion yuan, accounting for nearly one fifth of the country's assets. Since the construction of "Tianjin Commercial Factoring Innovation and Development Base" in October 2020, TEDA has issued 20 major industry innovation policies, attracting more and more enterprises to invest and settle down.

PPG SPEEDS UP DEVELOPMENT IN TEDA



Operating in Tianjin for around 30 years, PPG is undergoing a transformation from the world's biggest coatings production base to a coatings innovation R&D centre. Recently, the company has focused on battery pack

coatings of new energy vehicles. PPG plans to invest nearly 200 million yuan in 2022 to build an intelligent travel coating application centre in TEDA, which will provide solutions for improving the endurance capacity and fire resistance of batteries. The project will be put into operation in 2023.

PPG is a leading supplier in coatings and special materials worldwide. Its first plant in China was located in TEDA in 1994. Backed by the fully-fledged industry chain and superior business environment, the plant is now the largest coatings production base of PPG in the world. Established in TEDA in 2018, PPG Global Coatings innovation Centre, the only world-level R&D centre other than the one in the US, will be completed by the end of this year.

TIANJIN'S 1ST IP FINANCIAL LEASING PROJECT LANDS IN TEDA

Recently, the first IP financial leasing project of Tianjin was set up in TEDA, which is one more significant move for Tianjin to build a financial innovation operation demonstration area.



Orich Medical Equipment (Tianjin) Co., Ltd., a company from TEDA, needed financing of nearly 10 million yuan in a month to produce and provide the movable CT vehicle, dental treatment vehicle and makeshift surgical vehicle for the Winter Olympic Games. On the basis of policies such as Regulations on Intellectual Property Protection in Tianjin, Binhai New Area launched the financial leasing new mode of "IP permit for the second time", which means that enterprises transfer the usage right of IP, and leases the IP from the financing institution. Orich Medical Equipment obtained financing of nearly 10 million yuan and delivered medical vehicles for the Games.

PAYLOAD RECORD HIT BY LONG MARCH-8



The Long March-8 Y2 carrier rocket was launched at the Wenchang Space Launch Centre in Hainan Province at noon on February 27th. 22 satellites were sent into space, hitting a new record of putting multiple payloads into orbit in a single mission. The rocket was manufactured and assembled by Tianjin Industrialization Base for China's Next-gen Carrier Rocket in TEDA, which is also a new carrier rocket developed in TEDA, following Long March 5, Long March 5B and Long March 7.

Tianjin Industrialization Base for China's Next-gen Carrier Rocket which integrates rocket parts production, component assembly and final assembly testing and trial, has become one of the cores of China's aerospace manufacturing industry. The Base mainly undertakes the final assembly, quality characteristic measurement and inspection and testing after the final assembly for the new-gen large and medium-sized carrier rockets.

Developing the rural collective economy will not only greatly enhance productivity and increase farmers' income, but also help them better cope with the uncertainties arising from market fluctuations, Wang said.

Along with the deepening reform in rural areas and continuous improvement of the socialist market economy, the rural economy is facing both challenges and opportunities, he said.

"Encouraging private enterprises to participate in the rural collective economy is a powerful measure to develop the collective economy, and consolidate and expand the achievements of poverty alleviation, as well as an effective method to promote rural revitalization and achieve common prosperity," Wang added.

China will fully consolidate and build on its achievements in poverty elimination by promoting rural revitalization, according to the 2022 Government Work Report.

The country will further support areas that have been lifted out of poverty in developing distinctive local businesses, and bolster labour collaboration and vocational skills training, to help people who are no longer in poverty steadily increase their income, the report said.

More efforts should be made to actively explore the innovative models of the rural collective economy in accordance with local resources and characteristics, which is of great significance in achieving

common prosperity, Wang said.

He also called for joint efforts to expand the cooperation scope by rural collective economic organizations and private enterprises, develop the mixed economy in rural areas, further optimize the allocation of rural resources and guide more private enterprises to take part in rural revitalization.

Established in 1995 in Hunan province, Better Life has become a retail conglomerate covering supermarkets, convenience stores, shopping centres, commercial complexes, logistics and transportation. It operates over 700 brick-and-mortar stores nationwide.

Rural revitalization is a critical way to help achieve common prosperity, said Wei Houkai, head of the Rural Development Institute at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences.

Wei said the key to promoting all-round rural revitalization lies in stimulating the indigenous vitality of rural areas, establishing a modern rural industrial system with distinctive and competitive features, and building a mechanism to increase the income of farmers.

Despite the unprecedented impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, China has accomplished its poverty alleviation target on schedule. The final 98.99 million impoverished rural residents have all been lifted out of poverty, and all 832 impoverished counties and 128,000 villages had been removed from the poverty list by the end of 2020.

In addition, Long Haibo, a senior researcher at the Development Research Center of the State Council, the nation's Cabinet, said digital technologies, including 5G, artificial intelligence and cloud computing, are playing an increasingly important part in bridging the digital divide in rural areas, empowering the healthcare and education industries, and promoting the rural-urban economic integration and rural revitalization. **B**

BETTER LIFE HEAD STRESSES PRIVATE FIRMS' RURAL ROLE

Wang Tian, chairman of retail and real estate company, Better Life Group, said that private enterprises should play a bigger role in developing the economy and bolstering revitalization in rural areas, and helping achieve common prosperity.

Rural revitalization is a critical component of the Chinese government's 2020–2025 work plan. The overarching aim of rural revitalization is to make China, a still largely traditional agricultural country, into "a modern, socialist

country that is prosperous, strong, democratic, culturally advanced and harmonious" by 2049. As China is at a historical juncture of moving toward its second centenary goal, the Chinese central authorities seek to achieve this by consolidating the achievements of poverty alleviation and pushing for the modernization of the agricultural sectors and rural areas, as demonstrated by recent plans and announcements put forward by the Chinese central government.



THE IMPACT OF THE RUSSIA-UKRAINE WAR ON TRADE

Ukraine is a very important country for global trade in crops such as wheat, and the Russian invasion of the country could have widespread repercussions. The invasion will not only affect Ukraine's trade flows but also global flows as sanctions are placed on Russia.

Many economies around the world contracted in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and a large number of macroeconomic factors showed sharp declines. Global exports fell by about 7%, according to data. Ukraine's exports were only moderately affected, falling by 1.6%. This was a potential sign of strong inelastic demand for its goods.

Ukraine's net trade balance was also reduced in 2020, by about \$6.3bn, as the decline in its imports outstripped that of its exports. Ukraine imported \$53.7bn worth of goods and exported \$49.2bn.

Although Ukraine was only the 46th-largest exporter globally in 2020, it does specialise in certain goods, and the world does have a reliance on Ukraine for these goods. The Russian invasion will at least affect Ukraine's short- to medium-term ability to export these commodities.

In 2020, Ukraine was the second-largest cereal exporter, behind the US. In fact, Ukraine's cereal exports were slightly higher than Russian cereal exports. Iron and steel were other notable export commodities for Ukraine; however, in

a global context, Ukraine is only the 37th-largest exporter.

In 2020, Ukraine was the fourth-largest exporter of maize globally, exporting \$4.9bn worth of maize and accounting for 13% of the world's total maize exports, the fourth-largest exporter of barley, accounting for 12% of total world exports, and the fifth-largest exporter of wheat and meslin.

Ukraine's economy is still heavily focused on its agriculture, forestry and fishing industry. The sector has seen year-on-year growth for the past several years. Even in the pandemic crisis of 2020, it grew by 9%. The industry is on track to record another strong performance in 2021. Latest figures up to the third quarter of 2021 show a 32% increase year on year compared with the first three quarters of 2020.

In 2020, agriculture, forestry and fishing constituted Ukraine's third-largest sector by gross value added. Wholesale and retail trade and manufacturing were the only sectors to contribute more to the domestic economy.

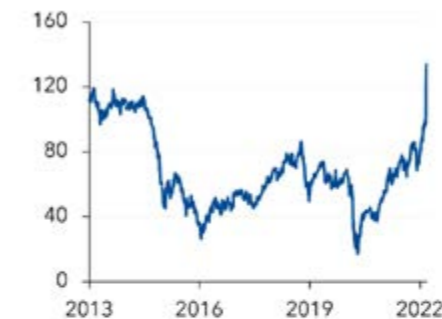
Ukraine is the largest exporter globally of sunflower seeds, which it specialises in due to its favourable climate and fertile soil. In 2020, Ukraine exported \$5.3bn worth of this commodity.

China is Ukraine's biggest trade partner (by exports). In 2020, Ukraine exported \$7.1bn worth of goods to China, 14.5% of Ukraine's total exports. China relies on Russia for access to western European export markets and the international financial system. In terms of trade, Russian exports to China are seven times more than those of Ukraine.

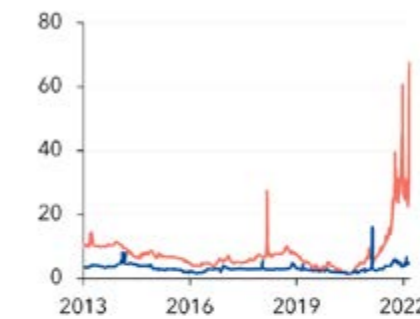
Poland and Russia were Ukraine's second- and third-largest export partners, respectively, and Ukraine exported \$3.3bn and \$2.7bn worth of goods to these countries in 2020.

Ukraine is also important in that it imports goods from other countries. A damaged Ukraine indirectly causes damage to other economies as demand for their goods will decline. Indeed, Ukraine's total goods imports in 2020 amounted to \$53.7bn. It ranked 47th globally in terms of import trade

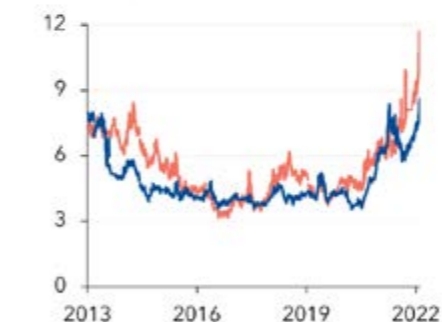
Brent Crude Oil (\$US/barrel)



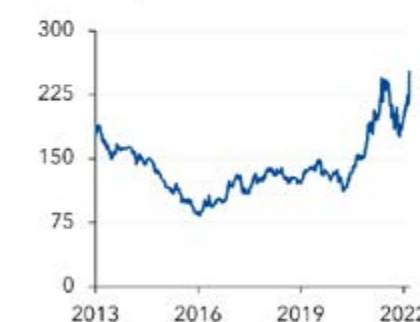
European & US Natural Gas* (\$US/MMBtu)

value. Ukraine imports the most goods from China, Germany, Russia, Poland and the US.

Ukraine's main imports include mineral fuels, nuclear reactors, vehicles, and electrical machinery and equipment. Combined, these four commodities accounted for almost half (46%) of total Ukrainian imports in 2020.

Economic powerhouses such as China and the US, as well as neighbouring economies, rely on Ukrainian exports.

Given Ukraine's unenviable position, it is more likely to be currently demanding weaponry and aid. The countries mentioned above, among many others, will suffer if Ukraine's fall in demand is not picked up by other countries. Some may be more impacted than others. Neighbouring countries will be the most affected as costs will likely rise, although major economies such as the US and China will likely switch to other sources.

Although Ukraine is a relatively small economy in terms of world trade, it

is nonetheless important with regard to several commodities. The Russian invasion will have a direct global impact on products such as sunflower seeds, maize, barley and wheat, where Ukraine has a significant comparative advantage. Ukraine is also a key player in several other commodities.

The war will heighten the already shaky economic conditions created by COVID-19. Many companies are exposed to the conflict. Supply chain problems will continue despite thoughts these would ease in 2022. Additionally, inflationary pressures will affect more countries. Furthermore, sanctions are already decimating the Russian economy, with the ruble in freefall, while companies are looking to divest. Investment conditions in eastern Europe will weaken as investors urge caution and await a peaceful outcome. **B**

A HOLOGRAM OF YOURSELF IS THE LATEST THING!

A hologram is not a new concept, especially with it being shown on so many sci-fi movies.

Nowadays, you won't find many people who don't know what a hologram is, but for the rare ones left who don't know, here is a simple definition.

A hologram is created when 3D objects are photographed using lasers and are restored as accurately as possible. The technique is called holography and the result is called a hologram. A hologram is a 3D image of an object with perfect accuracy.

There has been a lot of innovation in 3D technology, including holography. An amazing start-up called The Looking Glass Factory uses this technology to put holograms on your desktop. It makes your images lifelike and virtually real. They claim that any 3D model that you have, or anything from the Unity app, or even photographs are taken with your mobile phones can be captured in 3D by The Looking Glass Factory. You can put a model on your desk to enjoy a

3D hologram of yourself, and you don't need a VR or AR headset to view it.

HOW IT WORKS

The Looking Glass Factory has taken this up a notch with its combination of technologies, creating probably the most advanced form of hologram display in the world. They have special software developed specifically for creating and using holographic content. In addition to this software, advanced optics and custom electronics are used.

The Looking Glass is powered by the company's proprietary light field technology developed, and using this proprietary light field technology around 45-100 views of a

3D scene can be generated. It displays a full-colour, dynamic 60fps 3D hologram in a Looking Glass Factory frame, and this can be viewed by multiple people simultaneously. These are physically present holograms that you can touch. Amazing, isn't it?

The Looking Glass is not only a frame that you get, but there are a lot of software integrations and plug-ins that come with it. These can be used to transform almost any type of 3D content into a hologram. It is user-friendly and can be easily used by beginners as well as advanced users.

THE FUTURE

With gadgets like the Looking Glass, telecommunication and optics are becoming more advanced, and with 5G, technology transmission is becoming faster.

The use of holograms is becoming common, and this technology can be used in many fields, but most effectively in designing. You can look at an image, enlarge it, touch it and manipulate it in 3D while in progress. This can revolutionize the design process.

A new technique called photophoretic optical trapping is also being worked on. Recently, Brigham Young University's

researchers developed a projector system that projects full-colour 3D floating images in the air.

Another field that can do wonders with holograms is education and training. Holograms can bring mixed reality to the fore and make education fun and easy. The same goes for training; since holograms are 3D visuals, they offer an easy and interactive way of learning.

There are many other fields where holograms can be used, such as in research, information technology, engineering and medicine. One cannot think of a world in the future that does not include the use of holograms and related technology. **B**

THIS SOLAR-POWERED FLOATER CAN CLEAN PLASTIC FROM THE RIVERS

Marine pollution is a global crisis that needs immediate attention from all of us. It is a threat to marine life and animal life. Water is not only vital for marine life but is also important for animal life. Our water sources include rivers, seas, oceans, glaciers, etc. Due to pollution, these water bodies have impurities and toxins that are fatal to living beings.



Many animal species are endangered because of the toxicity of the water. There are organisms in oceans that are naturally endowed to purify water, but they can't handle the number of chemicals that are thrown into the seas. As a part of the ecosystem, we should take responsibility for the trash we keep adding to the already polluted waters.

Many marine animal species are becoming extinct because of our carelessness and abuse of the ecosystem. Despite many green campaigns and environment-friendly campaigns, there is still a lot to be done. Many attempts have been made to clean the rivers, but they all face different challenges and limitations.

Interceptor is the latest project to clean the most polluted rivers of the world. It is a solar-powered vessel attached to a barrier, and it fishes plastic waste out of water.

HOW DOES THE INTERCEPTOR WORK?

The body of the interceptor consists of three sections: the conveyor belt, the shuttle, and six dumpsters. The conveyor belt accumulates the plastic waste from the river water and sends it to the shuttle. The shuttle then distributes it to the six dumpsters inside the vessel.

The interceptor can collect around 50,000 kg of junk per day, but on good days and in perfect conditions, this

quantity can go up to 100,000 kg daily.

It is designed as a very environmentally-friendly machine, and is completely solar-powered, with no carbon dioxide footprint. The solar panels are placed at the top of the white exterior body.

The device is placed facing the river bank. The waste barrier is placed at the water level upstream, and this lets the current push the garbage towards the conveyor belt at the mouth of the vessel.

Currently, four to five such vessels are working in the rivers in Indonesia, Malaysia, Vietnam, and the Dominican Republic. The project aims at launching

these vessels to clean the 1,000 most polluted rivers of the world by 2025.

THE FINAL VERDICT

This vessel is the result of a decade's worth of research and hard work. But this alone is insufficient to serve the purpose. To clean the water is just one step; the complete process includes keeping it clean as well.

Such projects are vital for maintaining a healthy environment. We sow what we reap. If we look after nature, nature will look after us. In ancient civilizations, looking after Mother Nature was part of the culture. Maybe it's time to go back to the basics. We have damaged our environment extensively in the name of progress.

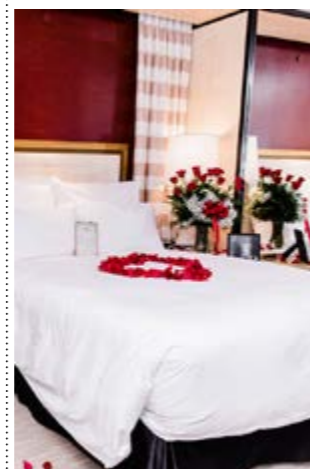

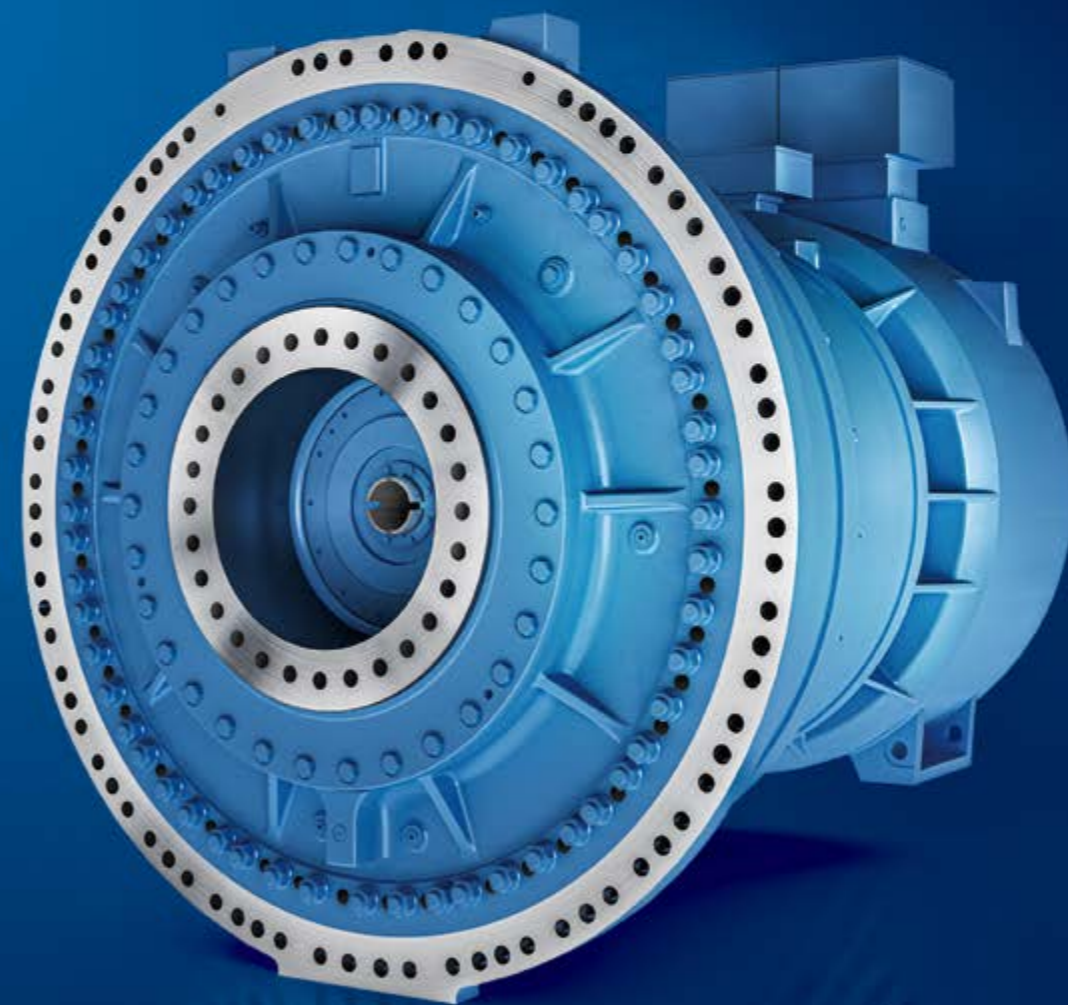
